By moving firewood, you could be transporting highly destructive invasive forest pests and diseases. Infested wood is often hard to identify.

Don't take a chance.
Don't move firewood!

## HELP PROTECT OUR TREES AND FORESTS!

### **Buy Local, Burn Local**

Buy firewood as close as possible to where you're going to burn it and ask suppliers where they source their wood before purchasing.

Heading camping? Follow the regulations outlined in the National and Provincial Parks you are visiting.

If you have to travel with firewood, make sure it is kiln-dried and follow all firewood movement regulations.



# WHAT ARE INVASIVE FOREST PESTS?

Invasive forest pests are insect and disease species that are found outside of their naturally occurring range and harm the forest's health and ecosystem function. Moving firewood from one location to another can inadvertently move invasive forest pests to new areas resulting in destruction for forests and urban trees.
